- (c) whether it is also a fact that the management of the Mill issue two separate receipts for the sale of one maund of sugar, one for Rs. 45 and another for Rs. 7;
 - (d) if so, the reasons therefor;
- (e) what is the rate at which the National Sugar Mill purchases sugarcane:
- (f) the reason as to why there is such a big difference of price between the sugar mills at Ahmedpur (West Bengal) and the mills of Bihar and U.P.; and
- (g) whether any financial assistance has been given to the Ahmedpur Sugar Mill or to any of its agencies by the Central Government?

The Deputy Minister of Agriculture (Shri M. V. Krishnappa): (a) No. Sir.

- (b) The Mills produced only about 300 tons of sugar for the first time in 1959-60 on trial basis and, it is reported, disposed of the same at Rs. 52 per maund in the locality.
 - (c) Yes, Sir.
- (d) The position is being investigated.

The Mills are reported to have purchased sugarcane at the following prices:—
