Plan to increase Power Generation in Gujarat during 1983-84

7020. SHRI MOHANLAL PATEL : Will the Minister of ENERGY be pleased to state :

(a) whether Gujarat Government has prepared a plan for the year 1983-84 and has submitted it to the centre;

(b) if so, what are the delails thereof the action taken by the centre thereon;

(c) what is the demand of power of Gujarat State;

(d) what is the present power production; and

(e) what steps are being taken to meet the gap?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE (SHRI MINISTRY OF ENERGY. SHEKHAR SINGH) CHANDRA (a) and (b) The State Government have proposed an outlay of Rs. 211.10 crores for power generation schemes in their Annual plan for the year 1983-84. After discussions with the state representatives, the Planning Commission have agreed to an outlay of Rs. 177.52 crores. Wanakbori unit No. 3 of 210 MW capacity is likely to be commissioned during 1983-84.

(c)The Eleventh Annual Power Survey has projected the following demand of power for Gujarat in 1983-84—

Peak demand	2411 MW
Energy requirement	13409 Mkwh

(d) The gross energy generation in Gujarat from April, 1982 to February, 1983 was 9800 MU.

(e) The present installed capacity in Gujarat is 2826 MW and projects of 1855 MW capacity are under execution. In addition, Gujarat will get a share of 357 MW from the centrel sector Korba uper Thermal Power project. The State will also be allocated shares from the Central sector Vindhyachal Super Thermal PowerProject and Kakarpara Atomic Power Station.

(c) if not, whether any such films were prepared and sent for approval to the corporation and the details thereof; and

(d) the action taken by the Corporation in this regard ?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING AND IN THE DEPART-MENT OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS (SHRI MALLIKARJUN) :

(a) to (d) The National Film Development Corporation has not taken any special steps to finance films highlighting the cultural heritage of Himalayan region. However, the Films Division, Bombay has produced a number of documentary films on this subject. During the years 1980-81 to 1982-83, the Films Division produced Orchids of Sikkim'. 'Spring in Sikkim' and 'Abode of Gods' A number of items concerning cultural heritage of Himalayan region have also been included in Indian Newsreels.

Automatization of C.B.M. Exchanges

7023. PROF. NARAIN CHAND PARA-SHAR : Will the Minister of COMMUNI-CATIONS be pleased to state :

(a) whether any programme of priority has been drawn up for the automatization of C.B.M. Exchanges at the district headquarters, for which the foundation stones have been laid during the past three years including the current financial year 1982-83;

(c) the likely date by which the automatisation would be completed ; and (d) if not, whether any such programme is proposed to be drawn up alongwith the names of such Exchanges for which the foundation stones have been laid?

No special consideration is given for priority on account of laying of foundation stones for buildings. Efforts are made to coordinats building construction where required with availabilicy of equipment.
