Government have so far extended subsidies on the above scale for the employment of 55 additional supervisors by the Cooperative Central Banks to work the full finance scheme.

Incident at Ambala Cantt. Station

1816 Shri Mohan Nayak: Will the Minister of Railways be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that a passenger ran amuck at Ambala tonment Railway Station on the 18th November, 1960 and injured several people with his sword;
- (b) if so, the number of Railway employees injured;
- (c) the number of passengers injured; and
- (d) what compensation Railway is going to give to the victims?

The Deputy Minister of Railways (Shri Shahnawaz Khan): (a) Yes. Sir, A man ran amuck at Ambala Cantt. on 18th November, 1960 and injured 16 persons with his Kirpan.

- (b) and (c). 5 Railway Employees and 11 Passengers.
- (d) Only one Railway employee received grevious injuries and had to be admitted in the Hospital. question of compensation to be paid to him will be decided after he is discharged from hospital and the extent of his disability is known. Meanwhile an ex-gratia payment of Re. 200 has been made to his family for meeting urgent expenses connected his treatment and also half monthly payments, as admissible under Workmen's Compensation Act, have been arranged.

Railway Land

The Deputy Minister of (Shri Shahnawaz Khan): (a) Surplus Railway lands fit for cultivation, and not immediately required for Railway purposes are handed over to the State Governments for licensing them out to cultivators for growing food crops in connection with Grow More Food Campaign. Besides this. tructions have also been issued Railway Administrations to hand over surplus Railway land, not fit for cultivation, to State Governments for afforestation purposes

(b) and (c). Railways do not permit grazing on Railway land but grass is auctioned yearly for being cut and removed. So also fruits from trees auctioned annually. Dead trees are also disposed of by Sale auction. Private parties are granted rights to grow trees on Railway land.
