2862. SHRI N. K. SHEJWALKAR: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state the steps taken to enable young scientists to pursue their research ideas without being hampered by hierarchal obstructions?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY, ATOMIC ENERGY, SPACE, ELECTRONICS AND OCEAN DEVELOPMENT (SHRI SHIVRAJ V. PATIL): The Report of the Working Group on Science and Technology for the Sixth Plan has recognised the need "for a more purposeful and satisfying involvement of younger research workers in the major scientific establishments, universities, public sector R&D institutions and other organisations supported by Government on a continuing basis".

- 2. The Department of Science and Technology has initiated several steps in this regard. Some of the important measures already being implemented are:
- The Department has formulated a new Scheme in the Sixth Five-Year Plan entitled "Promotion of Scientific Interest in Youth" under which direct financial support is extended exclusively to scientists in the younger age group below 35 years for taking up research projects on their own ideas and themselves acting as Principal Investigators without being hampered by any hierarchical system.
