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oluments (i.e. pay and all allowances) and 1-1/2 times the daily allowance to which they would be entitled from the date of their departure from Delhi to their arrival back in headquarters, as a lump sum honorarium.

(d) Since the amount of honorarium to be paid to each Central Government official would depend on the total emo-

luments drawn by him and the rate at which daily allowance is admissible to him for the duration of his stay in Assam, which also varies from individual to individuals, it is not possible to indicate the total expenditure incurred in this behalf. Moreover, the payment is to be made by each Ministry/Department in respect of its officials and as such no centralised information is available.
