be feasible for a single agency to formulate and implement comprehensive village development plans. A number of agencies are continuously involved in this task and an attempt is being made by the Ministry of Rural Development to dovetail programmes for assistance to the rural poor with the other on-going infrastructural development programmes in the area. Both Integrated Rural Development and National Rural Employment Programmes which are the major poverty alleviation programmes implemented by this Ministry and are in operation in all the blocks in the country envisage planning on the basis of the local resources and potential and integration with other ongoing programmes.

and (d) Gram Panchayats been established in all States and Union Territories except the States of Meghalaya and Nagaland and the Union tories of Lakshadweep and Mizoram. According to information available elections to gram panchay ats after the due date have not been held in three States. State Governments have been requested by the Union Government to ensure that elections to Panchayati Raj bodies are held in time. Functions of the Panchayats relating to village development are laid down in the respective State legislations with provide for the establishment of these bodies.

Ring towns around national capital

7690. SHRI RAM VILAS PASWAN: Will the Minister of WORKS AND HOUS-ING be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there is any proposal under consideration to develop ring towns around the national capital;
- (b) if so, the broad details of the proposal; and
- (c) how far Government are likely to succeed in removing congestion from the national Capital?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF WORKS AND HOUSING (SHRI MOHAMMED USMAN ARIF): (a) to (c) The Master Plan of Delhi recommen-

ded that the Plan for Delhi should be formulated in the context of regional dimensions and suggested a broad framework of the National Capital Region. Taking cognizance of this recommendation the National Capital Region Plan was prepared which envisaged the decentralisation of certain economic activities away from Delhi metropolis into different ring towns within the region so that the prosperity and burdens of urbanisation are shared by the region and balanced development of the region is promoted. basic aim of the National Capital Region Plan is to keep within the manageable limits the population and area of urban Delhi and ensure orderly growth of the region. For this purpose, the plan envisaged the development of 18 selected ring towns loca. ted in the adjoining districts of UP, Haryana and Rajasthan. The implementation of the National Capital Region plan did not make much headway for want of adequate funds and in the absence of a Statutory planning and coordinating authority. In 1980 the Central Government decided to revitalise the National Capital Region Plan. In August 1982 an agreement was reached between the Union Minister for Works & Housing and the Chief Miniesters of U.P., Rajasthan, Haryana and the Governor of Delhi on the need for a Statutory Planning and Coordinating machinery for the National Capital Region in order to effectively oversee all the developments in the area on the basis of an agreed plan. A Central Scheme for the development of National Captial Region is in operation and it is proposed to include maximum number of ring towns under this scheme in the coming years so as to create an impact on the hinter land/region and achieve the goals of dispersal of population in entire region.
