- 2888. Shri Dharmalingam: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:
- (a) the principles on which the allotment of tyres for trucks and buses is made; and
- (b) whether it is a fact that small operators find it very difficult to get tyres for their use?

The Minister of Industry (Shri Manubhal Shah): (a) Government normally do not deal with the distribution of indigenously manufactured tyres.

- (b) Due to the general shortage of tyres in the country some complaints have been received regarding non-supply of tyres of certain sizes and the following steps have been taken to make available tyres to genuine consumers at fair prices:
- (1) The gap between the demand and indigenous production is being made up by imports through State Trading Corporation.
- (2) Every effort is being made to increase the indigenous production by Licensing more capacity for manuture of tyres in the country.
- (3) Tyre Dealer's Association have been formed all over the country to register demand from genuine consumers of tyres and make supplies to them at regular intervals at list prices.
