(a) whether a number of Junior Translators have been recruited in the Central

Bureau of Investigation under his Ministry during the last one year;

(b) if so, the number of persons so recruited alongwith their educational qualifications in each case and the qualifications prescribed for the post;

(c) whether a few of them have been selected even though they do not fulfil the required qualifications prescribed for the said post;

(e) if so, the reasons for selecting persons with less qualifications and ignoring the *ad-hoc* persons working as Junior Hindi Translators and having the required qualifications?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF STEEL AND MINES (SHRI N. K. P. SALVE): (a) to (c). Recently, owing to severe power cuts imposed on the aluminium smelters in the country, the production has declined considerably. In case the demand for aluminium picks up and the indigenous production is not able to meet the demand, imports would be arranged to meet the gap.
