(b) the number of Indians who visited East and West Pakistan separately during the same period?

The Prime Minister and Minister of External Affairs (Shri Jawaharlal Nehru): (a) 83,194 Pakistani Nationals visited India from East Pakistan and 53,341 from West Pakistan during the period from 1st November, 1960 to 28th February, 1961.

(b) 58,100 Indian Nationals visited East Pakistan and 29,395 visited West Pakistan during the corresponding period.

N.B.—The above statistics include figures in respect of Assam only upto 31st January, 1961; but do not include figures in respect of Gujarat.
