Scholarships to Children of Political Sufferers in Madras State

The Minister of Education (Dr. K. L. Shrimall): (a) The Government of India have already given their administrative approval to the Government of Madras for the implementation of their scheme of educational concessions to the children of political sufferers for the year 1960-61. The Government of India's share of expenditure will be released when the State Government has intimated the

exact expenditure incurred during 1960-61. Similarly, the Government of India's share for 1961-62 will be sanctioned when the figures of expenditure incurred are received from the State Government during 1962-63.
