THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI A.A. RAHIM): (a) Yes Sir.

(b) to (d) Pakistan is aware of Government of India's serious concern on this subject. However, the matter did not come up for discussion at Indo-Pak Joint Commission Meeting held in June 1983. Government continues to keep a careful watch on all developments that may adversely affect India's security.
