Out of a total number of 46 recommendations/observations made by the Railway Reforms Committee in Part I Report, action on 43 recommendations since been finalised. The remaining 3 recommendations are under consideration.

Sikri Report on Promotional Policy

- SHRI A. K. ROY: Will the 815. Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that the Railway Accident Enquiry Committee (1978) headed by Shri S.M. Sikri in its report has stressed that promotional policy on Railways has resulted in deep discontent amongst staff and steps should be taken urgently to modify the policy to mitigate the more glaring aspects of discontent:
- (b) if so, salient points of the Report of the said Committee on promotional polics; and
- action taken by the Government to modify the policy in that light?

THE MINISTER OF RAILWAYS (SHRI A.B.A. GHANI KHAN CHOU-DHURY): (a) Yes.

(b) and (c) The Accidents Committee Report highlighted the inadequate promotion prospects in view of larger number of posts being in the initial grade of recruitment and fewer posts in the higher grades, resulting in stagnation at the recruitment grade for many years. The problem has, however, been solved to a great extent by the cadre restructuring in various departments as result of which the percentage of higher grade posts has been increased reducing the percentage in lower grades. The staff in Group 'C' and 'D' has benefitted by such cadre restructuring and the chances of promotion have become better.

- if not, the action taken by the appropriate Government against these Federations under the Trade Unions Act, 1926?
