Anti-India demonstrations in Bangladesh

- 897. SHRI B.V. DESAI: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:
- (a) whether the people of Bangladesh demonstrated against India over the Farakka issue;
- (b) if so, whether Prime Minister of India's effigy was burnt in Dhaka;
- (c) whether any decision to launch a movement for the boycott of Indian goods has been taken by Bangladesh;
- (d) whether India has taken a serious view of the demonstration and attitude of Bangladesh towards India; and
- (e) whether any protest has been lodged with the Bangladesh Government over it?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI A.A. RAHIM): (a) to (c) Some people staged some demonstrations, and at a meeting of the Farakka Border Raids Resistance Committee, a portrait of the Prime Minister was reportedly burnt. Some political groups also announced a campaign to boycott Indian goods.

(d) and (e) The Secretary concerned in the Ministry of External Affairs called the Bangladesh High Commissioner at New Delhi to express the Government of India's concern over this anti-Indian campaign in Bangladesh. The matter was taken up again with the Bangladesh Government at the highest level during the visit of the Secretary to Bangladesh last month.

Survey of Illiterate Population

898. SHRI K. PRADHANI: Will the Minister of EDUCATION AND CULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have conducted any survey regarding the illiterate population in the country;

- (b) if so, the details in this regard, State-wise; and
- (c) the details regarding the scheme of Government to remove illiteracy alongwith its targets to be achieved, Statewise, yearly?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRIES OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHRIMATI SHEILA KAUL): (a) and (b) A statement-I showing Statewise number of illiterates based on 1981 Census is attached.

- (c) The steps taken for removal of illiteracy are as under:—
 - (i) Elementary Education (including adult education) has been made part of the Minimum Needs Programme.
 - (ii) Universalisation of Elementary Education and eradication of adult illiteracy have been included in the New 20-Point Programme.
 - (iii) Special Central assistance is being given to the educationally backward States under the centrally sponsored scheme of non-formal education for elementary age group children.
 - (iv) Emphasis is being laid on covering districts/areas having literacy rate below the national average under the centrally sponsored scheme of Rural functional Literacy Projects and State Adult Education Programme.

No targets have been fixed for Sixth Plan.

However, State-wise coverage of the adult illiterates in the age group 15-35 under the Adult Education Programme during the first three years of the Sixth Plan is given in attached statement-II. During 1983-84, about 52.60 lakh adult illiterates in 15-35 age group are proposed to be enrolled under the programme.
