Indo-U.S. Joint Commission

903. SHRI VIRDHI CHANDER JAIN: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) the subjects discussed at the meetings held recently in Delhi of the Indo-U.S. Joint Commission; and

(b) the results achieved in those meetings?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI A. A. RAHIM): (a) and (b) The 5th Session of the India and United States Joint Commission on Economic, Commercial, Scientific, Technological, Educational and Cultural Cooperation was held in New Delhi on 30th June, 1983. The deliberations of the Joint Commission were presided over jointly by Shri P.V. Narasimha Rao, Minister of External Affairs, Government of India, and Mr. George P. Shultz, Secretary of State of the United States of America. The Agreed Minutes of this Session of the India-United States Joint Commis-

sion stated the desire of both sides to step up their cooperation in the various fields encompassed by the Joint Commission. These cover the working of the Science and Technology, Education and Culture, Economic and Commercial Affairs and Agriculture Sub-Commissions.

Unmanned level crossing Accident near Channasandra Bangalore
