2071. SHRI MADHAVRAO SCINDIA: Will the Minister of FOOD AND CIVIL SUPPLIES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the prices of vegetables and vanaspati ghee have been rising steadily despite good rains in the various parts of the country;
- (b) if so, to what extent the prices of the major vegetable like tomatoes, onions, potatoes and various vanaspati and edible oils have increased during the past three months indicating the comparative prices in August and October 1983; and
- (c) steps taken or being taken to keep these prices under check?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE DEPARTMENT OF ELECTRONICS AND THE MINISTRY OF FOOD AND

CIVIL SUPPLIES (DR. M.S. SANJEEVI RAO): (a) There has been some increase in the prices of vegetables during the past few months but the price of Vanaspati has remained more or less steady.

- (b) The index number of wholesale prices of tomatoes onions, potatoes and various edible oils including vanaspati for the months of August, September and October, 1983 are indicated in a statement.
- (c) For making essential commodities available to the consumers at reasonable prices, the main thrust of the Government policy is to increase the production oft various commodities. The Public Distribution System is being expanded. Some commodities are being imported. The export of essential commodities is regulated. The State Government and Union Territory Administrations are enforcing the provisions of the Essential Commodities Act and similar legislations.
