the Purli-Vaijnath Station of the Central mailway, giving the particulars and the amount of thefts and pickpocketing during 1959-60 and 1960-61;

- (b) what efforts have been made to punish the offenders;
- (c) whether it is a fact that the above has been a permanent feature on this station; and
- (d) in how many cases the amounts have been recovered and made good to the passengers during the above period?

The Deputy Minister of Railways (Shri Shahnawaz Khan): (a) and (b). Statement giving the required particulars, is placed on the Table of the House. [See Appendix III, annexure No. 71].

(b) Vigorous investigation of the cases reported, is promptly undertaken and thorough enquiries made about the known criminals operating in the area affected.

A watch is also kept on the known black spots and patrolling has been intensified.

(c) An analysis of the over-all crime position shows that the situation at Purli-Vaijnath hardly warrants any anxiety and is well under control.

## Telephone Subscribers in Malegaon
