

Per Capita Expenditure

2981. **Dr. Samantsinhar:** Will the Minister of Planning be pleased to state:

(a) the State-wise statement of per capita amount of expenditure provided in the Third Five Year Plan; and

(b) on what basis this amount is calculated?

The Deputy Minister of Planning (Shri S. N. Mishra): (a) and (b). Provisions under a Five Year Plan have to be considered in relation to the State plans, plans of the Central Ministries and those falling within the private sector. It is not possible to estimate these in terms of per capita expenditure in different States or regions.

Hindustan Machine Tool Factory

2982. **Shri Ajit Singh Sarhadi:** Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that certain trainees have been sent for training by the Hindustan Machine Tool Factory to Japan in watch manufacture; and

(b) if so, whether they were selected from amongst the staff and employees of the Hindustan Machine Tool Factory or from outside?

The Minister of Industry (Shri Manubhai Shah): (a) and (b). Yes, Sir. Out of 51 trainees deputed to Japan, 43 were recruited from outside on an All India basis and 8 were selected from the staff of Hindustan Machine Tools Ltd.

Workcharged Staff of C.P.W.D.

2983. **Shri Tangamani:** Will the Minister of Works, Housing and Supply be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that liberalised pension rules have been made applicable on the workcharged staff of the Central P.W.D.;

(b) if so, whether option has been

asked for from the permanent work-charged staff; and

(c) if not, the reasons therefor?

The Deputy Minister of Works, Housing and Supply (Shri Anil K. Chanda): (a) Yes.

(b) Yes.

(c) Does not arise.

Electric Connections in Quarters

2984. **Shri Tangamani:** Will the Minister of Works, Housing and Supply be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that all but 32 quarters in the 'C' Block of West Vinay Nagar have been provided with electric connections; and

(b) if so, the month and year when the electric connections were made in this block, and the reason for not giving supply of electricity so far to 32 quarters?

The Deputy Minister of Works, Housing and Supply (Shri Anil K. Chanda): (a) Yes.

(b) Service connections in the other quarters in the 'C' Block of Netaji Nagar were given by the New Delhi Municipal Committee in 1958. On account of some misunderstanding, the New Delhi Municipal Committee did not provide connections in these 32 quarters. Service connections have now been given, and meters are now being installed.

Industries in Dandakaranya

2985. **Shri Chintamani Panigrahi:** Will the Minister of Rehabilitation and Minority Affairs be pleased to state:

(a) whether there has been proposals for starting industries in the Dandakaranya area;

(b) if so, the industries proposed to be started in Dandakaranya area; and

(c) the amount of money invested or proposed to be invested in such industries?

The Minister of Rehabilitation and Minority Affairs (Shri Mehr Chand Khanna): (a) to (c). The attention of the Hon'ble Member is invited to the Progress Report regarding the Dandakaranya Project for the period from the 1st February, 1961 to the 30th June, 1961, which was circulated to the Members of the Sabha on the 17th August, 1961.

International Silk Congress

2986. Shri Kalika Singh: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

(a) the benefits accruing or likely to accrue to India as a result of Indian participation in the International Silk Congress held in London; and

(b) what pieces of Indian silk or silk fabrics were exhibited in "2000 years of Silk" exhibition?

The Minister of Industry (Shri Manubhai Shah): (a) Exchange of information concerning research and latest developments in the sericulture industry.

(b) Government did not send any silk fabrics to the Congress for exhibition.

Survey of Ancillary Industries in Madras

2987. Shri Balakrishnan: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

(a) whether a survey of the ancillary industries is going on in the Madras State; and

(b) if so, what are the items of ancillary industries which will be covered by the survey?

The Minister of Industry (Shri Manubhai Shah): (a) Yes, Sir. The National Council of Applied Economic Research has been entrusted with the survey of Ancillary Industries in the Madras State.

(b) The survey will cover the entire State in respect of the following 15

groups of industries:

- (1) Industrial Machinery.
- (2) Agricultural and Earth Moving Machinery.
- (3) Machine Tools.
- (4) Industrial, Scientific and Mathematical instruments (Mechanical).
- (5) Locomotives and Rolling stock, Ships and Air-crafts.
- (6) Bicycles.
- (7) Boilers and Steam Generating Plants.
- (8) Other Prime Movers—Steam Engines, turbines and International Combustion Engines.
- (9) Automobiles.
- (10) Commercial, Office and Household Equipment.
- (11) Electrical Machinery and Equipment.
- (12) Tele-communication Equipment.
- (13) Industrial Instruments (electrical).
- (14) Radios.
- (15) Air Conditioners and Cold Storage Equipment including Refrigerators.

Export of Iron Ore to Czechoslovakia

2988. Shri Chintamani Panigrahi: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

(a) the total amount of iron ore agreed to be exported to Czechoslovakia in 1961; and

(b) the port from which this ore is proposed to be exported?

The Minister of Commerce (Shri Kanungo): (a) Approximately 9·60 lakh tons.

(b) Bombay, Calcutta, Vizag, Madras, Cochin, Karwar, Belekeri, Mangalore, Redi, Coondapur and Honavar.
