Prices of Cotton Textiles

2989. { Shri C. K Bhattacharya: Shri Tangamani; Shri Kunhan:

Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the formula evolved by the then Commerce and Industry Minister for reducing the price of cotton textiles i_5 being evaded by certain mills by making a change in the quality of production by reduction of picks and or counts;

(b) whether it i_s a fact that Government have little hand in fixing the prices of these new varieties;

(c) whether Government have received any representation from any trade association about their difficulties in securing goods from the mills; and

(d) if so whether Government have taken any action in the matter?

The Minister of Commerce (Shri Kanungo): (a) to (d). The approval of the Textile Commissioner has to be taken before a mill produces a new sort. The price of the new sort has also to be got approved. It will not, therefore, be correct to say that the formula for fixing the prices is being evaded. Representations from certain trade associations about the difficulties in securing goods have been received, but by and large it has been reported that textile goods are available at stamped prices. The situation is under Government's constant review.

The Deputy Minister of Works, Housing and Supply (Shri Anil K. Chanda): (a) A sum of Rs. 20 crores was originally provided for slum clearance in the States in the This Year Plan. Second Five amount was, however, subsequently reduced as a result of the reappraisal of the Plan resources to Rs. 12.99 crores of which Rs, 9.75 crores represented the Central assistance and the balance as the States' own contribution.
