Noonmati Refinery

1624. Shri P. C. Borocah: Shrimati Mafida Ahmed:

Will the Minister of Steel, Mines

- (a) whether the workers of the Noonmati Oil Refinery in a meeting held in the middle of September demanded re-employment of the workers retrenched from the construction of the refinery, provision of civil amenities for the workers and their families and payment of compensation for land acquired for the railway marshalling yard; and
- (b) if so, what action has since been taken by Government on these demands?

The Minister of Mines and Oil (Shri K. D. Malaviya): (a) Yes, Sir, but the question of payment of compensation was not raised in the meeting, nor does it concern the Indian Refineries Limited.

(b) Steps are being taken to assist the workers, to be retrenched in securing alternative employment at the Barauni Refinery Project or elsewhere as far as possible. Medical and water facilities have been provided to all the employees and their families. Arrangements for the accommodation of about 100 key personnel have so far been made.

Oil Technicians
