72. Shri Tangamani: Will the Minister of Information and Broadcasting be pleased to state:

- (a) whether invitations were extended to leading actors in India for the Film Festival held in Delhi:
 - (b) if so, on what basis; and
- (c) the reasons for the absence of several leading artists from Tamiland?

The Minister of Information Broadcasting (Dr. Keskar): (a) to (c). Prominent film artists were invited to the II International attend Festival of India at New Delhi. Special invitations were also extended, in consultation with the film industry, to the more important artists in the film production centres. number of leading artists from Madras also attended the Festival. Most of those invited attended. Two leading artists from Madras, Shri M. G. Ramchandran and Shrimati Padmini could not attend though they were invited.

- (d) Exports of footwear are not controlled and hence it is open to any exporter to export it. Exports to State Trading countries are undertaken by the State Trading Corporation of India. The promotion of exports of rubber (including canvas) shoes is the responsibility of the Chemical and Allied Products Export Promotion Council, while the Leather Export Promotion Council is responsible for promoting exports of leather footwear. Promotion of exports is not done State-wise.
