Central Council of Health

193. Shri Shree Narayan Das:

- (c) whether the recommendations made have been considered by Government; and
- (d) if so, the result of such consideration?

The Minister of Health (Shri Karmarkar): (a) and (b). The following important subjects were discussed:

Centilevered Passes at Jamuna Bridge

104. Shri Shree Narayan Das: Shri Radha Raman:

Will the Minister of Railways be pleased to refer to the reply given to Unstarred Question No. 3611 on the 6th September, 1961 and state:

- (a) whether the Delhi Municipal Corporation has since deposited the necessary charges for preparation of plan and estimate for the construction of centilevered passes on either side of the Jamuna bridge;
- (b) if so, whether plans and estimates have teen prepared;
- (c) what further steps have been taken in this regard; and
- (d) whether the condition of the road meant for vehicular traffic has been renovated?

The Deputy Minister of Railways (Shri Shahnawaz Khan): (a) to (c). The proposal is to provide a 6 feet wide footpath only for pedestrian traffic centilevered out from the Down Line girders of the bridge, and not on both sides. This has been approved by the Municipal Corporation of Delhi only in October, 1961. approximate estimated cost of the work is Rs. 4.70 lakhs. The Municipal Commissioner of Delhi Corporation has been requested by the Railway Administration to arrange for the necessary deposits towards the cost of preparation of plans and detailed estimate.
