the custom at these catering establishments was small, the establishments were quite unremunerative and adequate alternative arrangements were found possible. At Tumkur, departmental catering did not obtain.

960 Farraka Barrage

- (a) whether the initial objections raised by Pakistan on the Indian decision to proceed with the construction of the Farraka Barrage have been by now explained to the party concerned; and
- (b) what are the basic objections and whether there are any of a political nature that Pakistan has raised over this issue and the way Government have explained away these objections?

The Deputy Minister of Irrigation ond Power (Shri Hathi): (a). Yes.

(b). Pakistan's protest at the decision to proceed further with the execution of the Farakka Barrage Project was based on the alleged contravention of the agreement between the two countries on a co-operative approach to the development of rivers common to India and East Pakistan. They had reiterated the need for such an approach and their anxiety (mentioned in October, 1951) of the consequences of the contemplated diversions for this Project to the agriculture economy and commercial life of East
