

**C.H.S. Dispensary at West Patel Nagar,
New Delhi**

163. Shri S. M. Banerjee: Will the Minister of Health be pleased to state:

(a) whether the rush of patients at the West Patel Nagar, New Delhi C.H.S. Dispensary is very heavy as compared to other C.H.S. Dispensaries;

(b) whether the present number of Doctors and staff is not sufficient to cope with the rush; and

(c) if so, the action being taken to relieve the congestion at the said dispensary?

Delhi Milk Scheme

164. Shri Ramam: Will the Minister of Food and Agriculture be pleased to state:

(a) whether home delivery arrangements have been made by the Delhi Milk Scheme to supply milk at home from their booths in North Avenue and Feroze Shah Road; and

(b) if so, the details thereof?

The Deputy Minister of Agriculture (Shri M. V. Krishnappa): (a) and (b). An arrangement for home delivery in five selected residential localities viz. North Avenue, South Avenue, Feroze Shah Road, Canning Lane and Electric Lane was undertaken by the Delhi Milk Scheme in the middle of August, 1960, and is in operation.

The home delivery of milk is effected from the depots of the Delhi Milk Scheme located at North Avenue, South Avenue, Canning Road, Dr. Rajendra Prasad Road and Atul Grove Road through the part-time watchmen.

In addition to the price of milk, an additional charge of 4 nP. per bottle is realised for this service.

Porters at Delhi and New Delhi Railway Stations

165. Shri Ramam: Will the Minister of Railways be pleased to state:

(a) the number of porters registered at Delhi and New Delhi Railway stations;

(b) whether any demand has been received to increase the portorage charges; and

(c) the existing scale of rates they are permitted to charge?

The Deputy Minister of Railways (Shri Shah Nawaz Khan): (a). The sanctioned strength of licensed porters at Delhi and New Delhi Railway stations is 1140 and 330 respectively.

(b). Yes.

(c) The existing scale of portorage rates at Delhi and New Delhi stations are as under:—

(ii) Small wheel barrow for luggage (less than 10 maunds)	0.62

(iv) Stretcher for invalid, lifted by 2 porters	0.50
(v) Stretcher for invalid lifted by 4 porters	1.00
(vi) Waiting charges for period upto ¼ hour	0.31
(vii) Waiting charges for period upto 1 hour	0.62
