- (ii) The Railways are providing lifting barriers operated from cabins at the level crossings close to the cabins within the station yards on a phased programme.
- (iii) Stop Boards have been provided on the road approaches at all unmanned level crossings on either side of the level crossings as a warning to the road traffic.
- (iv) Whistle Boards have been fixed on the track warning the engine drivers to whistle and be cautious while approaching the unmanned level crossing.
 - (v) The Ministry of Transport & Shipping have directed all State Governments to provide speed at the approaches of breakers unmanned level crossings.
- (vi) Surprise checks are being conducted in co-ordination with the State Governments to ensure compliance of safety rules by the road vehicles.
- (vii) Rules have been made by State Govts. under Motor Vehicle Act that road vehicle drivers should stop short of unmanned level crossings and cros the track with Conductor walking ahead.

Creation of 'Professor of Eminence'

3200. SHRI MADHAVRAO SCIN-DIA: Will the Minister of EDU-CATION AND CULTURE be pleased to state:

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRIES OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHRIMATI SHEILA KAUL): (a) and (b). A proposal to institute positions of "Professors of Eminence" in Universities

approved as part of the revision of salary scales of teachers in Universities and Colleges with effect from 1.1.1973. The proposal envisages institution of 100 such positions at any given time in the Universities on a salary of Rs. 3000/- per month. Only serving Professors who have reached a very high level of academic distinction an expected to be nominated for these positions by the Universities. Committee appointed by the UGC for different groups of disciplines will make the selections. The UGC had invited nominations for consideration under the scheme, but no selection have so far been made.

"Blue Books" for Value Orientation of Teachers
