National Professorships were instituted in 1949 to honour eminent scholars who have made outstanding contributions to knowledge in their field. Scholars of eminence who have attained the age of 65 years or more are conferred these awards. The National Professors are paid a consolidated salary of Rs. 3000/- per month. The award is made initially for a period of 5 years which is extendable by another 5 years. Thereafter, a life pension of Rs. 1000/- per month is paid to them. The awards are made on the recommendations of a committee of Union Ministers.

(b) Between 1949 and 1965, 9 awards were made. Thereafter, 2 awards were made in 1980, and 1 in 1983. There are only two national professors at present. They are Dr. Salim Ali, a distinguished Ornithologist and Prof. V.K.R.V. Rao, an eminent Economist.

## Letters of Intent to NRIs

- 4511. SHRI K.T. KOSALRAM: Will the Minister of INDUSTRY be pleased to state:

THE MINISTER OF COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY AND OF THE DEPART-MENT OF SUPPLY (SHRI VISHWA-NATH PRATAP SINGH): (a) to (c). Since the setting up of the Special Approval Committee to deal with applications from non-resident Indians in November, 1983, 47 applications for import of capital goods, 40 applications for grant of industrial licence/permission, 10 applications for entering into foreign collaboration and 15 applications for composite clearances have been received from non-resident Indians upto 2nd July, 1984. During this period, 25

approvals for grant of letter of intent/permission, 26 approvals for import of capital goods valuing Rs. 1496.19 lakhs approx. and 15 approvals for foreign collaboration have been accorded to the non-resident Indians. These approvals cover 45 industrial schemes, which are under various stages of implementation.

## Ban on small scale sector to manufacture Automobiles
