The expenditure is equally shared by Centre and State Governments on (50:50) basis. The State-wise details of bonded labourers identified/released and rehabilitated are given in the enclosed Statement.

(e) and (f) The details of funds released during last three years to the States are given below. No funds were sought by the State Government of Gujarat during the last three years. The area-wise details are not maintained
