To meet the shortages Air India has been utilising the services of retired pilots on contract basis

The availability of pilots in Indian Airlines has improved considerably due to rationalisation of training schedule, change in carrer pattern of Commanders and introduction of Productivity Linked Incentive Scheme.

Investment in Tourism Sector

(a) to (d) The Department of Tourism prepared a working paper in 1993 enlisting the activities to be taken up by various agencies to attract 5 million tourists to India. According to national estimates, the investment required for the same amounted to Rs. 39.100 crores which was to be shared between Central and State Governments, Public Sector undertakings and the private sector.

The main areas of investment were airports, aircrafts, railways, roads, civil amenities, resorts, accommodations, restaurants, shopping complexes, tourist facilitation centres, convention centres. Human Resource Development and Training. No phased programme has, however, been drawn up for the investment of this amount due to non-availability of resources.

Representations for Direct Air Services

One Programme Production Centre at Shimla and twenty seven TV transmitters of varying power are presently operational in the State of Himachal Pradesh. While the number of TV transmitters in Himachal Pradesh compares favourably with most of the other States, percentage of area and population covered by these transmitters in the State is less than the national average because of hilly terrain which restricts the extent of resultant co erage from the transmitters. However, with a view to further augment TV service in the State, 23 transmitters of varying power are presently under implementation and 7 TV transmitters, including one HPT, are envisaged to be set up in the State subject to availability of resources and infrastructural facilities, Location-wise details of the existing transmitter projects as also those under implementation/envisaged to be set up in Himachal Pradesh are given in the enclosed Statement.
