Competitive Examination for Recruitment to Central Information Service (Grade IV)

Will the Minister of INFORMATION & BROADCASTING be pleased to state

(a) when the Union Public Service Commission conducted the first open competitive examination for recruitment to Central Information Service (Grade IV),

(b) the total number of posts advertised and the total number of candidates selected for appointment from amongst the general candidates,

(c) The total number of Departmental candidates, if any appointed against these advertised posts, without competing for the said examination

(d) the criteria adopted for appointment of such departmental candidates, and

(e) whether the results of the above examination were declared and communicated to the competing candidates if not, the reasons therefor?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI DHARAM BIR SINHA) (a) The first direct recruitment to Grade IV of the Central Information Service, on the basis of written tests and interview, was made in 1964 65

(b) 171 posts were advertised by the Commission. The number was subsequently reduced to 70. The Commission recommended 68 candidates for appointment

(c) and (d) 101 officers were declared as departmental candidates, in consultation with the Union Public Service Commission, in accordance with the Central Information Service Rules and appointment to Grade IV of the Service on the recommendation of the Commission on the basis of assessment of the work of these officers reflected in their Confidential Reports, and interview, where considered necessary.

(e) In terms of the advertisement candidates selected by the Commission at their discretion appeared in a written test held in June July 1964 and only those who attained in the written test a minimum standard of efficiency, prescribed by the Commission, were called for interview. On the basis of written tests, held on the 2nd and 3rd June, 1964, 334 candidates were assessed as suitable for being called for interview and they were interviewed by the Commission in August September 1965. Candidates, other than those who, on the basis of their interview, had been recommended for appointment were informed by the Commission individually that they had not been selected. Offers of appointment to Grades of the Central Information Service were issued by the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting to the persons selected and recommended by the Commission
