Separate Adviser for Homocopathy

7690. SHRI ZIAUR RAHMAN ANSARI: SHRI RAIDEO SINGH.

Will the Minister for HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there is a separate Advisor for Homocopathy but for not Unan;
- (b) whether Government are considering to establish Ali India Institute for Unant; if not, the reasons therefor; and
- (c) whether Government's attention has been drawn to the necessity of opening Unani Dispensary under Central Government Health Scheme; if so, the steps Government propose to take in this behalf?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING (PROF. D. P. CHATTO-PADHYAYA): (a) There is a separate honorary Adviser for Homocopathy. For

- Ayurveda, Unan: and Siddha Systems of Indian Medicine, there is a common Adviser who is also assisted by a Senior Research Officer (Unani).
- (b) No, there is no provision in the Fourth Five Year Plan for the setting up of any such Institute.
- (c) There is no appreciable demand for the opening of any Unani dispensary under the Central Government Scheme. However, the matter is under consideration.

Shortage of Doctors in Rural Areas

- 7691. SHRI ZIAUR RAHMAN ANSARI: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING be pleased to state:
- (a) whether there is acute shortage of doctors in rural areas; and
- (b) if so, whether Government are considering to appoint Hakims instead?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING (PROF. D. P. CHATTOPADHYAYA): (a) In so far as Primary Health Centres are concerned, only about 3.4% of them were without doctors as on 31st December, 1971. However, in the rural areas as a whole there is shortage of doctors.

(b) Efforts are being made to strengthen the medical and health care facilities in the rural areas by the utilisation of the available manpower under the various systems of medicines including the indigenous systems.
