Extension of Fare Concession Banefits to Senior Citizens

- 310. SHRI MADHAVRAO SCINDIA: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:
- (a) whether the Government have received demands for extending the fare-concession benefits permissible to senior citizens in respect of different classes of rail travel above the second class travel and also to raise the concession to 50%.
- (b) if so, the reaction of the Government thereto:
- (c) the estimated loss of revenue per annum, in case the fare concession to senior citizens are extended in respect of the travels upto the second AC two-tier and three tier?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI SATPAL MAHARAJ): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) and (c). The Railways are already granting 25% concession in second and sleeper class without any distance limit to senior citizens of the age of 65 years and above, as a special case despite diminishing budgetary support. If the concession to senior citizens is extended to higher classes, the estimated loss of revenue would be approximately Rs. 70 crores per annum. Keeping in mind the increasing cost of operation, maintenance of trains, etc., any further relaxation is not possible due to financial constraints.

THE MINISTER OF LABOUR (SHRI M ARUNACHALAM). (a) to (d). The information is being collected from the Government of Gujarat and will be laid on the table of the House.

Declaration and Inclusion of Certain Places in Tourist Spots

312. SHRI SUKH LAL KUSHWAHA : SHRI HARIVANSH SAHAI :

Will the Minister of TOURISM be pleased to state .

(a) whether the Union Government are considering to declare and include the historical and philosophical

places like Chitrakut. Amarkantak. Devtalab and Maihar of Madhya Pradesh and Ayodhya hills of Parulia in the list of the tourist spots to attract the foreign tourists

- (b) if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND MINISTER OF TOURISM (SHRI SRIKANTA JENA: (a) to (c). Declaration of Tourist Spots is primarily the responsibility of the State Government, however the Department of Tourism extends financial assistance for specific projects to the State Governments based on their merits, inter-se priority and availability of funds. The Department of Tourism has provided funds for the construction of a Cafetaria, a Yatri Niwas at Chitrakut and a Yatrika at Amarkantak

Tourism Infrastructure in Ajanta and Ellora

- 313. SHRI UTTAMSINGH PAWAR: Will the Minister of TOURISM be pleased to state:
- (a) the steps taken to strengthen the tourism infrastructure in Ajanta and Ellora and the expenditure incurred as a result thereof during the last two years
- (b) the income earned during the last two years on account of visits of tourists to Ajanta and Ellora caves
- (c) whether the National Park Services of USA has prepared any plan for the development of these caves
 - (d) if so, the details thereof; and
- (e) the time by which the said development plan is likely to be implemented?

THE MINISTER OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND MINISTER OF TOURISM (SHRI SRIKANTA JENA) : (a) The Government has entered into a Loan Agreement with the Overseas Economic Cooperation Fund (OECF) Japan in January. 1992 for Conservation and Development of Ajanta and Ellora in Maharashtra. The OECF assistance is to the tune of 3.7 billion Japanese Yen, the Project is expected to be completed by December, 1996. The major components of the project are afforestation, upgradation of aerodrome facilities at Aurangabad, strengthening of roads, augmentation of water supply and sewerage, improvement of electricity supply, conservation of monuments and visitor management facilities. The OECF loan is not available in advance. The implementing agencies i.e. State Governments have to first incur expenditure from their own resources and then claim reimbursement from the OECF.

Rs. 18.98 crores for Ajanta Ellora project has already been reimbursed by OECF.

(b) The income earned as per information provided by the Archaeological Survey of India is as follows.

Tourists Arrivals

- 314. SHRI KRISHAN LAL SHARMA: Will the Minister of TOURISM be pleased to state:
- (a) whether according to the latest figure. India still accounts for 0.4% of world tourists arrivals and 0.7% of tourism receipts;
- (b) if so, the reasons for this dismal figures despite so much stress has been given on boosting tourism:

(c) the India's comparison of figures with the figures of other countries of the region in this regard; and

(d) the measures being taken by the Government to improve India's position in World tourism?

THE MINISTER OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND MINISTER OF TOURISM (SHRI SRIKANTA JENA): (a) to (d). India being a developing nation infrastructural facilities are limited. The main reasons for the low share of India in the world tourist traffic are accessibility and infrastructural facilities. The measures being taken by Government to improve India's share in world tourism include continuous improvement of infrastructural facilities, development of tourist attractions, focussed publicity and marketing abroad, etc.

Survey regarding Potential of Tourism in Kutch Region

- (a) whether the Union Government have surveyed the potential of tourism in the Kutch region of Gujarat; and
- (b) if so the programme chalked out by the Union Government for the development of Kutch region for pilgrim and adventure of tourism?

THE MINISTER OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND MINISTER OF TOURISM (SHRI SRIKANTA JENA) (a) and (b). In the Tourism Policy of Gujarat, the State Government has identified Kutch as a potential area for development of Tourism.

The State Government has prepared a Master Plan for the infrastructural development of Kutch distt. for the promotion of tourism. The Department of Tourism provided funds for Kutch Festival during 1995-96.

Surat-Bhusaval Railway Line

- 316. SHRI MAHESH KANODIA: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:
- (a) whether the Government propose to double and electrify the Surat-Bhusaval railway line,
 - (b) if so, the details thereof; and
 - (c) if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI SATPAL MAHARAJ): (a) to (c). Doubling of single line section is taken up when their carrying capacity is saturated. Over long sections, such doubling is taken up in phases to tackle the critical section first. In this case survey for doubling of Nardana-Amalner section (28 kms) has been taken up. The remaining section would be considered in due course as per requirements of traffic. The portion from Surat to Udhana and Bhusawal to Jalgaon is already electrified.
