SHRI Y. ESWARA REDDY:

Will the Minister of STEEL AND MINES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government of Mysore have requested the Central Government to allot Rs. 53 lakhs for the water supply scheme and Rs. 25 lakhs for exploratory work relating to the supply of limestone and dolomite in connection with Vijayanagar Steel Plant Project at Hospet, Mysore; and
- (b) if so, the reaction of Central Government thereto?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF STEEL AND MINES (SHRI SUBODH HANSDA): (a) No Sir.

(b) Does not arise.

Setting up of Ship-breaking Units in Public Sector

1634. DR. KARNI SINGH: Will the Minister of STEEL AND MINES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there is a proposal for setting up a few "ship-breaking" units in the public sector;
- (b) if so, the objects and economic usefulness thereof; and
- (c) whether some "ship-breaking" units already exist in India in the private sector and if so, the names thereof?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF STEEL AND MINES (SHRI SUBODH HANSDA): (a) to (c). In the Import Trade Control Policy for the current year provision exists for import of "re-rollable scrap only in the form of old ships for breaking". The import of such ships is canalised through the Metal Scrap Trade Corporation Limited. Although ship-breaking activity is one of the

functions included in the scope of the re-organised Metal Scrap Trade Corporation, so far the Corporation have not undertaken this activity themselves.

Ship-breaking results in generation of Scrap. Bulk of the resultant scrap is ferrous-scrap for 're-rolling'. Some quantities of melting scrap and non-ferrous scrap are also generated.

At present there is no organised activity in this sector. However, some parties—mostly located in Bombay—undertake breaking of these Ships, either themselves or through some sub-contractors. Some of these are as follows:—

- M/s. Viswanath Rupa & Co., Bombay.
- 2. M/s. Khanbhai Esoofbhai, Bombay/Calcutta.
- M/s. Steel Corporation of Bombay, Bombay.
- 4. M/s. Abid & Co., Bombay

- 6. M/s. Indian Metal Traders, Bombay.

Price preference in Government purchases

1635. SHRI P. M. MEHTA: SHRI M. C. DAGA:

Will the Minister of SUPPLY AND REHABILITATION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Ministry have decided to give price preference in Government purchases to the small-scale industrial units over the public sector enterprises; and
- (b) if so, to what extent, the concession will be granted and since when?

THE MINISTER OF SUPPLY AND REHABILITATION (SHRI R. K. KHADILKAR): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) Where the small scale unit and public sector enterprise quote in competition for the same store, the SSI unit would be allowed price preference upto 5 per cent over the public sector enterprise subject to the overall price preference range of 15 per cent which is admissible to the SSI units over the large scale units of the private sector. This is effective from the 15th March, 1973.

Manufacturing Schedule and Expansion Programme of Private Sector Industries

Will the Minister of HEAVY INDUS-TRY be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Ministry have asked the private sector industries to submit an advance outline of their manufacturing schedule and expansion programme for the coming five years;
- (b) if so, how many industries have so far submitted the same; and
- (c) the reaction of the Union Ministry thereto?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HEAVY INDUSTRY (SHRI DALBIR SINGH): (a) Yes, Sir

- (b) Fifteen, so far.
- (c) As soon as replies from a reasonable number of remaining units addressed are received, it is proposed to call the parties in each industry for a discussion in the course of which the basic format of their plans and the critical inputs required could be assessed so that a time frame for making available these inputs in close coordination with the production schedule could be worked out; also gaps in production, if any against the Five Year Plan requirements will be indentified in advance, for taking further steps to bridge the gaps.
