News item "Bombay Port hauls less Cargo"

2180. DR. RANEN SEN: Will the Minister of SHIPPING AND TRANS-PORT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether attention of Government has been invited to the news item "Bombay port hauls less Cargo" in the Economic Times dated 24th October, 1973; and
- (b) if so, the reaction of Government thereto?

THE MINISTER OF SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT (SHRI KAMLA-PATI TRIPATHI): (a) Yes. The newsitem is based on the press note issued by Bombay Port Trust giving salient features of the Port Trust's Administration Report for the year 1972-73.

(b) The traffic handled by the port of Bombay during 1972-73 was 15.54 million tonnes against 16.14 million tonnes in 1971-72. Such marginal fluctuations in port traffic do not call for any specific action.
