Utilisation of outlay for Small Scale Industries in Fourth Plan

6334. SHRI R. N. BARMAN: Will the Minister of INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AND SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY be pleased to state:

- (a) whether against the Original Fourth Plan outlay of Rs. 122.80 crores for setting up small scale industries with Central Assistance, net even 100 crores could be utilised; and
 - (b) if so, the reasons therefor?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRIAL DEVE-LOPMENT (SHRI ZIAUR RAHMAN ANSARI): (a) Against a total original Fourth Plan outlay for small scale industries and industrial estates of Rs 122.70 crores, the estimated expenditure was Rs. 86.06 crores.

(b) important among the reasons for under-utilisation of Fourth Five Year Plan outlay were shortage of certain raw materials and inadequacy of statistical information, credit facilities, industrial extension services and marketing facilities. To an extent, short-term solution of some of these problems are somewhat diffi-

cult owing largely to the widely persed nature of these industries, copecially the traditional and rural industries There were also delays in the formulation and sanction of the schemes and in organizing and streagthening institutional and other arrangements for providing assistance and facilities in various forms to these industries. Moreover, the shortfalls in production of a number of large industries which supplied raw materials to and purchase their requirements of parts and components from small industries, followed by the shortage of power, also adeversely affected the production of a number of small industries, including the handloom industry and ancillary units.

Bringing Back the Ashes of inte Rashbehari Bose from Tokyo
