THE CALLING ATTENTION TO MATTER OF PUBLIC IMPORTANCE

COAL

SHRI NIHAR LASKAR (Karimganj): Sir. I call the attention of the Minister of Railways to the following matter of urgent public importance and request that he may make a statement thereon:-

"The serious situation arising out of the reported decision of Southern Railway to cancel the trains due to shortage of coal".

THE DIPUTY MINISTER IN THE (SHRI MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS MOHD, SHAHI QURESHI): Mr. Speaker

There was no cancellation of trains due to shortage of coal recently as appeared in a news item on 20-2-1974 purporting to report the decision of the Southern Railway to this effect. The trains mentioned in the Press reports have been running normally according to schedule.

The Railways have been running, however, with low coal stocks, as stated by me in the House on 15-11-1973. I had mentioned in November that the Railways had been experiencing shrinking coal supplies in the preceding months and as a result the coal stocks of the Railways were low. I had mentioned also that in order to make available to the industries their Central Government has essential requirements of steam coal, the Government is to allow the sponsored suspension of some short-distance and less
