Abolition of Brand Names of Essential Drugs

2064. SHRI K. MALLANNA: SHRI SAT PAL KAPUR:

Will the Minister of PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government propose to abolish the brand names of essential drugs in a phased manner on the recommendation of the Hathi Committee on drugs;
- (b) whether Government have also framed any scheme of drastic changes in the whole structure of the drug industry in the country; and
 - (c) if so, the broad outlines thereof?

THE MINITER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS (SHRI K. R. GANESH):
(a) to (c). Government have appointed a Committee on Drugs and Pharmaceutical Industry under the Chairmanship of Shri Jaisukhlal Hathi with the following terms of reference:—

- (i) To enquire into the progress made by the Industry and the status achieved by it.
- (ii) To recommend measures necessary for ensuring that the public sector attains a leadership role in the manufacture of basic drugs and formulations, and in research and development.
- (iii) To make recommendations for promoting the rapid growth of the drugs industry and, particularly, of the Indian and small scale industries' sectors. In making its recommendations the Committee will keep in view the need for a balanced regumal dispersal of the industry.
 - (iv) To examine the present arrangements for the flow of new technology into the industry, and make recommendations therefor.
 - (v) To recommend measures for effective quality control of drugs, and for rendering assistance to small scale units in this regard
