(e) in obreal-based diets, inadequacy of calories is a more widely prevalent form of malnutrition. When calories are not adequate, protein also tends to get utilised as a source of energy, thus leading to protein malnutrition also. Breeding good quality rice varieties with a high yield potential could hence make an important contribution to the improvement of the nutritional standards of rice-eating people. Work on these lines is hence also in progress at the International Rice Research Institute, The Phillipines.

### Food Crisis in Karnataka

Karnataka as a whole is norma'ly self sufficient in rice, though some regions in the State are deficit The State Government is responsible for the dixtribution of foodgrains within the State and keeps in view the needs of the various regions. The State Government is also being supplied reaquantities of wheat and sonable coarse grains from the Central pool for issue through the Public Distribution System.

According to the information furnished by University of Delhi, it is not a fact that the Vice-Chancellor had blamed the Government the failure to implement the recontmendations of the Third Pay Commission. He had however, requested for expeditious decision in the matter. Necessary orders revising the scales of pay in respect of most of the nonteaching employees of the University have since been issued.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND IRRIGATION (SHRI ANNA SAHEB P SHINDE) (a) A statement is attached

- (b) The information is being collected and will be laid on the Table of the Sabha
- (c) and (d) India Supply Mission, Washington, has reported that some of the US suppliers with whom they have dealings are multinational Corporations, having operations in Canada, Argentina, Europe and Japan. The Mission has no information whether they have their field of operations in other countries
- (e) Imports of foodgrains are made from exporting countries like USA, Canada, Argentina, Australia, Sweden and EEC countries etc on commercial basis after taking into account the availability, the price and other relevant factors and the purchases are effected on terms and at a time advantageous to us. Offers to supply grain arise similarly in respect of food aid. Details in regard to offers of food aid made and accepted from different countries during 1972-73 to 174-75 are as under—

An offer made by the Government of the USSR to supply 2 million tonnes of wheat on loan basis in 1978 was accepted. The entire quantity has been received The replacement will commence in June, 1976 and the entire quantity will be replaced in five equal annual instalments.

Recently an offer has also been received from the Government of Thailand through our Embassy m Bangkok for the supply of 1 lakh tonnes of rice on Government to Government hasis

- (f) Having regard to the casy food situation then obtaining in the country it was decided to discontinue concessional food imports of foodincluding PL-480 purchases grains from the beginning of 1972 Owing to steep shortfall in the production during the last 2-3 years, imports of foodgrains had to be resorted to in a big way to maintain the public distribution system The heavy imports of foodgrains put a considerable strain on our scarce foreign exchange sources and in the changed context and keeping the overall economic situation in view it was decided to obtain foodgrains on such terms as will provide for a nominal rate of interest and payments spread over a number of years including purchases under Title I of the US Agricultural Trade Development and Assistance Act.
  - (g) An agreement was signed between the Government of India and the Government of USA on 20th March 1975 for the import of 300,000 tonnes of wheat, wheat-flour under Title I of the US Agricultural Trade

Development and Assistance Act. Mainly the terms are as follows:—

The export value of this commodity will be \$128 million f.o.b Five per cent of this amount (\$84 million) will be paid by India initially in cash and the balance (\$121.6 million).

will be on credit repayable in dollars over a period of 40 years, including a grace period of 10 years. The rate of interest on the loan will be 2 per cent per annum during the first 10 years and 8 per cent per annum during the remaining 30 years

(b) In pursuance of the Cultural' Agreement between India and Iraq signed in Baghdad on April 19, 1973, to promote and develop cultural, scientific and technical relations between these two countries in every possible-way, a Protocol on Scientific Cooperation in the fields of Agriculture and Animal Sciences between the Foundation of Scientific Research, Iraq, and
