Oilseeds Production

Will the Minister of AGRICUTLURE AND IRRIGATION be pleased to state :

(a) whether his Ministry is considering any steps for increasing production of oilseeds like rapeseeds and castor ;

(b) if so, facts thereof ; and

(c) whether despite the development activities oilseeds production had not kept page with the increasing demand for oils ?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND IRRIGATION (SHRI PRAB-HUDAS PATEL) : (a) and (b) Yes, Sir. It is proposed to increase the poduction of Rapeseeds and Castor by implementation of a Centrally Sponsored Scheme for the development of oi'seeds, which among others includes :--

- (i) Intensive Oilseeds Development Programme.
- (u) Extension of oilseeds to new irrigated areas.

The strategy proposed to be adopted under the Intensive Oilsceds Development Programme will be to implement

the package approach on an area basis in respect of each important oilseed cropincluding Rapesred and Castor, in the selected States where production technology has been well developed and the potentialities for the rapid growth in production are good. The programme is proposed to be implemented over an area of 3,85.000 hectares under rapeseed and mustard and 1,55,000 hactares under Castor by the end of Fifth Five Year Plan. The object of the scheme for extension of oilseeds to new irrigated areas is to extent cultivation of oilseeds, including Rapesced & mustard in the major irrigation project areas where good potentialities exist and to popularise improved techniques of cultivation to obtain maximum return per hectare. An area of 74,000 hectares under Rapesced & mustard will be tackled under the scheme by the end of Fifth Five Year Plan.

The other features of the Centrally Sponsored Scheme for Oilseeds Development in the Fifth Plan Under :--

- I. Provision of necessary facilities, by way of financial assistance for the production of Nucleus and Foundation seed is also to cover part of the expenditure on transport and handling of certified seed, to insure regular supply of pure seed of improved 'varieties sufficient to meet the requirements of the areas. to be brought under the programme is proposed.
- 2. Minikits, containing seeds of new oilsceds crops and new varities of oilsceds recommendated for the selected districts alongwith seed dressers and literature of package of practices are proposed to be supplied free of cost to the farmers in the first year of their introduction.
- 3. Organising mass plant protection campaigns through plant protection squards or on custom service basis. Provision of financial assistance is proposed to be made for this as also for transactional loss on plant protection chemicals.
- Laying out problem oriented demonstrations. Assistance is proposed to provide towards the cost of critical inputs for these demonstrations.
- 5. Provision of additional staff.

(c) The oilseeds/oil economy of the country during the past few years has been characterised by a basis shortage of supplies compared to requirements which have been rising rapidly mainly due to increase in population and improvment in purchasing power of the people. As a result, prices of oilseeds oils in the country have generally shown a rise in recent years.
