  - (v) The Government has established an autonomous organisation called the Rashtriya Sansk it Sansthan which controls and administers five Sanskrit Vidyapeeths which are being developed as centres of higher learning and research in the field of Sanskrit
- (vi) The Government has also been encouraging oratorial talents among the products of Sanskrit Pathshalas by organising an all-India Sanskrit Elocution Contest in various branches of Sanskrit learning

Apart from the above schemes which have been in operation some time, the Government has introduced a new scheme during the current year This scheme provides for establishment of Adarsh Sanskrit Pathshalas by developing selected institutions m each State as ideal institutions among the traditional Pathsheles Such selected institutions will be eligible for 95 per cent maintenance grant and 50 to 60 per cent great for non-recurring purposes./
