ing loss of revenue to the exchequer and inconvenience to officers waiting for accommodation;

(c) whether any unauthorised subletting of C.S.I.R. accommodation in Jamshedpur has come to the notice of Government: and

(d) whether Government have received any representation from staff in this regard and if so, the action taken thereon?

The Minister of Education (Dr. Triguna Sen): (a) No, Sir, not in disregard of the rules.

(b) No, Sir. Few quarters built in the premises of Low Shaft Furnace Plant are meant exclusively for essential staff, including security, attached to the plant and are not available for general allotment.

The quarter in question has since been occupied w.e.f. 1st April, 1967 and, being rent free, there is no question of any loss of revenue.

(d) No representation has been received from any staff member of the laboratory. However, representations from some Associations have been received. Since these are not recognised Associations, no reply has been sent.

A Memoranwith the draft Cadre dum along Rules, Recruitment Rules and Initial Recruitment Regulations have been sent to all State Governments on 31-3-1967. Further steps to constitute the Service will be taken as soon as their comments are received.
