- The Deputy Minister of Food and Agriculture (Shri A. M. Thomas): (a) In 1961-62, the Central Warehousing Corporation opened 4 warehouses in Andhra Pradesh at Tadepalligudem, Duggirala, Rajahmundry and Vijayawada, and proposes to open two more warehouses in 1962-63.
- (b) and (c). These warehouses provide facilities of scientific storage and preservation of agricultural produce with a view to enabling the farmers to obtain better value for it. Loans can also be obtained from the banks against warehouse receipts.
- (d) The banks generally give advance upto 60 per cent to 75 per cent of the market value of goods deposited in the warehouses at rates of interest which are ½ per cent to 1 per cent lower than the usual market rates.

## Failure of Engines on Naupada-Gunupur Railway Line

1664. Shri Ulaka: Will the Minister of Railways be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government are aware that the light engines on the narrow gauge line between Naupada and Gunupur sometimes fail in the middle of the way;
- (b) whether it is also a fact that the failure of light engines has become a regular feature on the said line; and
- (c) if so, what action Government propose to take in this matter?

The Deputy Minister in the Ministry of Railways (Shri Shahnawaz Khan): (a) Yes, Sir.

- (b) No. Sir.
- (c) Does not arise.

## Telephone Exchanges in Orissa

1665. Shri Ulaka: Will the Minister of Transport and Communications be pleased to state:

(a) the number of telephones subscribed by Government offices and public in Orissa upto March, 1962;

- (b) whether there is any proposal to pen new telephone exchanges in Orissa during the Third Five Year Plan period; and
- (c) if so, when and where they will be opened?

The Deputy Minister in the Ministry of Transport and Communications (Shri Bhagavati): (a) (i) No. of telephones subscribed by Government—1,900.

- (ii) No. of telephones subscribed by public—2,060.
- (b) and (c). Seven proposals as shown in Statement I, which has been laid on the Table of the House. [See Appendix II, annexure No. 92], have been sanctioned and exchanges are likely to be opened during 1962-63 subject to the availability of stores. 42 proposals as shown in Statement II, which has been laid on the Table of the House. [See Appendix II, annexure No. 92], are under consideration and will be sanctioned and implemented during the Third Five Year Plan, if found remunerative.

## Passenger Amenities on Parlakimedi Station

1666. Shri Ulaka: Will the Minister of Railways be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Parlakimedi station on the narrow gauge line between Naupada and Gunupur does not have a refreshment room of even a tea-stall even though it has become the crossing station of both the up and down light-trains and which has sub-divisional headquarters; and
- (b) if so, the action Government propose to take in this regard?

The Deputy Minister in the Ministry of Railways (Shri Shahnawax Khan): (a) and (b). A Railway-built tea stall has been lying vacant at Parlakimedi station, as no contractor is forth-coming, despite repeated notifications.
