## Mineral Plants in Kersla

- 47. Shri Manibhai J. Patel: Will the Prime Minister be pleased to state:
- (a) whether Government propose to take over some mineral plants from Kerals Government and to export the products separated from the beach sands of Kerals;
- (b) if so, the names of various products; and
- (c) the countries to which these products are proposed to be exported and the estimated foreign exchange likely to be earned per annum?

The Minister of State in the Department of Atomic Energy (Shri M. S. Gurupadaswamy): 'a) Indian Rare Earths Ltd.—a public sector undertaking, wholly subscribed by Central Government—is nesotiating with the Kerala Government to take over the assets of Hopkin & Williams (Travancore) Ltd.—a British firm—which closed down its plants in 1960 and whose assets were attached under the Revenue Recovery Act by the Kerala Government for non-payment of royalty dues.

- (b) After restarting the plants proposed to be taken over in Chavura, (Kernia State), Imenite, Monazite, Rutile & Zircon will be produced.
- (c) These products are proposed to be exported mainly to Japan. Czechoslovakia and U.K. The estimated foreign exchange likely to be earned per annum is as below:
