The Minister of Defence (Shri Y. B. Chavan): (a) and (b). Government have already issued orders reducing the minimum age limit for grant of emergency commissions in the Army from 20 years to 19 years. Government do not propose to reduce the minimum age limit of 17 years for enrolment of other ranks.

The Deputy Minister in the Ministry of Labour and Employment (Shri R. K. Malviya): (a) The Industrial Committee on Mines other than coal at its meeting held on the 3rd October 1962 recommended that the conclusions of the 19th and the 20th sessions af the Indian Labour Conference regarding the abolition of contract labour system generally, should be adopted for implementation in mines other than coal. The Industrial Committee also recommended that there should be no extension of contract labour in non-coal mines in the mean time. A statement showing the conclusions of the 19th and the 20th sessions of the I.L.C. is laid on the Table of the House. [Placed in Library. See No. LT-900/631.

(b) The recommendations of the Industrial Committee were brought to the notice of the Organisations of Employers and Workers, soliciting their assistance in implementing them. Progress reports on the action taken are being called for and the implementation of the recommendation is being watched.

Shri Rabindranath Tagore's Estate at Shilaidaha, Kushtia district has been substantially restored by the Department of Archaeology, East Pakistan Circle. It is also understood that steps are being taken to establish a museum and a library within the premises of the Kuthi Bari".
