The Deputy Minister in the Ministry of External Affairs (Shri Dinesh Singh): (a) An encounter between hostile Nagas and Village Guards took place near Zuikhu on 12th June, 1963, and not on 5th June, 1963.

(c) Security forces have intensified operations against hostile Nagas. Denial to the hostiles of the use of their camps and hideouts is a part of these operations.

(ख) इन उत्तरों का परीक्षण हो रहा है । विदित हो कि इन आरोपों में से कई एक लगभग दो वर्ष या उससे पहले कांग्रेस के अध्यक्ष को मिले थे । वे आरोपों एक उप समिति को भेजे गए, जो इस नतीजे पर पहुंची थी कि उनमें कोई तथ्य नहीं था । अब दून और दूसरे आरोपों का इकट्ठा ही उनके जवाबों के साथ परीक्षण हो रहा है ।

Construction of Pipeline by Chinese in Ladakh

(a) whether Chinese are constructing a pipeline from Tibet to Sinkiang;

(b) if so, whether this will pass through the area of Ladakh which is under their illegal occupation; and

(c) whether any protest has been lodged with the Chinese Government?

The Deputy Minister in the Ministry of External Affairs (Shri Dinesh Singh): (a) The Government of India are not aware of any oil pipeline being constructed by the Chinese from Tibet into Sinkiang.

Indian Emigrants to U.K.

Will the Prime Minister be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that in spite of the curbs imposed by the Commonwealth Immigrants Act, a steadily increasing number of Indians leave week after week to make Britain their home;

(b) if so, the number of Indians who have so far left since the imposition of the said curbs; and

(c) the Government's reaction thereto?

The Deputy Minister in the Ministry of External Affairs (Shri Dinesh Singh): (a) The cases of Indians going to the United Kingdom to make it their home are rare though Indians continue to go there to seek employment.

(b) Passports were issued to 3,758 Indian nationals during the first year after the coming into force of that Act, for proceeding to the United Kingdom for employment, excluding their wives and children. It is not possible to say how many of them will make Britain their home.

(c) Does not arise.

Contributions to Congo Civilian Operations Fund

*699. Shri Indrajit Gupta: Will the Prime Minister be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have received any request from the U.N. Secretary General for contributions to the Congo Civilian Operations Fund;

(b) if so, whether Government propose to make any substantial contribution; and

(c) the purposes for which the fund is being currently expended?

The Deputy Minister in the Ministry of External Affairs (Shri Dinesh Singh): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The request is under consideration of the Government.

(c) The contributions are required to meet expenditure on experts and technicians employed in Operational, Advisory and Training services in the basic fields such as public finance, economic coordination, transport and communications services, judicature, public administration, postal services, public works, public health, agriculture and on about 800 secondary school teachers.
