**The Minister of Defence (Shri Y. B. Chavan):** (a) Gen. Taylor did not visit India for any specific purpose. It is a normal practice for top officers of the Armed Forces to exchange visits with their counterparts in friendly countries. The Chief of the Army Staff, who had visited the United States in July 1963, extended an invitation to him to visit India. There was an exchange of views between the Government of India and Gen. Taylor, as is usual when a Chief of Staff of a friendly country visits India.

(b) No, Sir. The question of any agreement in this context does not arise.

**The Minister of State in the Ministry of External Affairs (Shrimati Lakshmi Menon):** (a) and (b). There have been no fresh Chinese inroads into Indian territory. As for the Chinese Government's position on the Colombo Proposals, there has been no change from the initial stand taken by the Chinese Government. China claims to have accepted the Colombo Proposals, "in principle", while maintaining reservations of substance in regard to the proposals.

#### Expansion of U.N. Security Council

Will the Prime Minister be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government of India have formulated their views regarding the enlargement of Security Council and the Economic and Social Council of the U.N.; and

(b) if so, the precise nature of proposals?

**The Minister of State in the Ministry of External Affairs (Shrimati Lakshmi Menon):** (a) and (b). The Government of India believe that in view of the increase in the membership of the Asian and African countries in the United Nations, it is necessary to enlarge the membership of the Security Council and the Economic and Social Council. India accordingly co-sponsored a resolution in the last session of the U. N. General Assembly, which was adopted
