The Minister of External Affairs (Shri Swaran Singh): (a) Government have drawn attention to the increasing nuclear threat posed by China's development of its nuclear weapons capability. Government's views on the subject are well-known and it has not been considered necessary to bring this matter to the specific notice of the major nuclear powers following the third Chinese nuclear explosion.

(b) and (c). The United States and the Soviet Union have not made any specific offer of nuclear protection to India.

The Minister of External Affairs (Shri Swaran Singh: (a) to (d). Immediately after the dissolution of the Peace Mission the Nagaland Paptist Church Council in their Meeting on 10th May, 1966, held at Kohima, passed a resolution that a Nagaland Peace Comimssion be formed to continue the work. They had suggested that the Peace Commision should comprise of Smt. Lakashmi Menon, Serva Shri Nabakrishna Choudhury, Mayangnokocha Ao, Nivukhu Sema and Vizol Angami. The Baptist Church Council sent a copy of this resolution to the Government of India. The Government considering the direct talks that are now going on with the underground Nagas felt that such a Commission is not necessary. The Baptist Church Council have been informed accordingly.
