Illegal Regime in Southern Rhodesia

Will the Minister of External Affairs be pleased to state:

- (a) the extent to which various countries have respected and acted according to the U.N. Resolutions on the subject of illegal racist regime in Southern Rhodesia;
 (b) whether any fresh attempt to compel the racist regime in this regard has been taken; and
 (c) if so, the nature and effect of the same?

The Minister of External Affairs (Shri Swaran Singh): (a) A large number of member states of the U.N. have implemented action called for in various UN resolutions, on Rhodesia. Some countries, however, have imposed only a partial ban on economic relations with the illegal regime. South Africa and Portugal have wholly ignored the resolutions of the UN and continue to trade and have other relations with the rebel Government on an even more extensive scale than before.

(b) and (c). This matter was discussed in detail at the recent Commonwealth Prime Ministers' Conference in London. Note has been taken of the UK Government's willingness to join in sponsoring in the Security Council of the United Nations before the end of this year, a resolution providing for effective and selective mandatory economic sanctions against Rhodesia, unless the Smith regime takes the initial and indispensable steps to end the rebellion.
