- (c) the effective steps likely to be taken by Government to improve its market position in the European Economic Common Market Zone?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF FOREIGN TRADE AND SUPPLY (SHRI CHOWDHARY RAM SEWAK): (a) The average price of Indian tea as compared to other teas is the highest in all ECIM countries.

(c) The Tea Board has been undertaking promotion of Indian tea in the European Common Market countries since 1964. In spite of the marketing rigidities, many pure Indian tea packets are now being marketed by the local packers. The Board's promotional activities comprise mainly of consumer sampling and store demonstration at focal points; sampling and display in local exhibitions and fairs and limited press advertising in addition to generic promotion for increased consumption of tea.

The fiscal reliefs granted by the Government of India towards excise and export duties on tea in 1968 and 1969 should also in general, help the exports of Indian tea to the E.C.M. market.

Export of Manganese Ore by Minerals and Metals Trading Corporation

4236. SHRI CHINTAMANI PANI-GRAHI: Will the Minister of FOREIGN TRADE AND SUPPLY be pleased to state:

- (a) the quantity of manganese ore exported by the Minerals and Metals Trading Corporation from May, 1969 to 31st July, 1969 through Ram Bahadur Thakur and Co.; and

Corporation exported 27,214 tonnes of Manganese ore to Czechoslovakia. The ore for this export was obtained from Messrs Ram Bahadur Thakur and Co.
