- at Geneva, is being studied with a view to determining the best way in which the new facilities can be exploited to the country's advantage.
- 13. A great deal of headway has been made in furthering the economic co-operation with UAR and Yugoslavia especially - at the recent Tripartite Meeting held at Blod in Salvania at the Ministerial level. Considerable progress has also been made in devising a complete framework for economic co-operation for trade liberalisation and development in Asia under the aegis of ECAFE. This will be followed in up further.
- 14. A long term trade agreement with the USSR is expected to be concluded very shortly.

A high level contour canal has also been recently approved. The integrated Scheme is expected to provide total irrgation of 1.74 lakhs acres. The construction of the dam and the canal system have been synchronised.
