Visit of J&K by Team of Officers

3817. SHRI CHAMAN LAL GUPTA: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Union Government have recently deputed a team of officers to visit J&K to study the situation created by Pak troops along the borders of J&K;

(b) if so, the details of reports submitted by the team of officers; and

(c) the action taken by Union Government thereon?

THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI L.K. ADVANI): (a) to (c) An Officer of Ministry had visited some of the affected areas to make preliminary assessment. As per available information, 2955 families from Bishnah, Samba and R.S. Pura Tehsils of Jammu district and Hiranagar Tehsil of Kathua District have been affected by the firing from across the border. The State Government have already announced certain relief measures for the victims of the border firing. The State Government have been requested to provide additional relief and also make available alternative shelters in the safe areas to the affected population.
