The incentive is given to the sugar factories in the form of extra free sale quota over and above the normal freesale quota of 60%. The freesale quota including the normal quota ● 100% is given for new sugar factories for 8 years in Other Recovery Areas (ORA) and for 5 years in the High Recovery Areas (HRA).

(b) to (e) The Incentive Scheme 1997 is still in operation and at present there is no proposal for withdrawing the same.

The State Government have reported that 4.96 lakh ration cards have been issued to families below poverty line.
